MUNICIPAL GREEN ENERGY GRANTS

POWER SAVERS PROGRAM

All nine members of DEMEC work with residential and commercial electric customers to voluntarily reduce energy consumption during peak energy usage times, with the Power Savers Program. These efforts attempt to reduce customer electric costs.

On days that large increases in electric usage are expected, DEMEC will encourage people to voluntarily avoid activities that will increase their use. Simple efforts like changing the thermostat 2-3 degrees, waiting to run the washer/dryer, and turning off unnecessary lights can help DEMEC avoid the extra kilowatts needed that day. This prevents a higher peak for all customers, saving electricity and money.
