What Is Home Performance with ENERGY STAR® (HPwES)?

HPwES takes a whole-house approach to saving money and energy. Do you have drafty rooms? Hot or cold spots? High monthly energy costs? If so, you might want to take advantage of this program. A specially trained participating contractor will come to your home to perform a comprehensive home energy assessment, install energy-efficient products and provide tips on potential upgrades.

What Is Assisted Home Performance with ENERGY STAR® (AHPwES)?

AHPwES addresses the same issues as HPwES but is available only to income-qualified Delaware property owners (and renters via their landlords) and offers the same services at a significantly reduced cost.

Why Should I Participate in Either Program?

- Utility cost savings of 20%+
- Fewer drafts and more comfortable rooms
- Rebates available to offset upgrade costs
- Work performed by trained contractors
- Healthier, safer, higher-quality home
- Decreased greenhouse-gas emissions
- Increased efficiency and lower monthly energy costs
- Low-interest loan available to pay for costs not covered by rebates

What Are Benefits Specific to HPwES?

- Reduced \$100 co-pay for assessment.
- Rebates are available for home improvement costs.

What Are Benefits Specific to AHPwES?

- Reduced \$50 co-pay for assessment.
- Rebates are available for home improvement costs.

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Your participating contractor might use a thermographic camera like this one to assess the effectiveness of your home's insulation.

What Happens During the Assessment for Either Program?

A participating contractor will come to your home to check for energy-efficiency issues such as...

- Insulation levels
- How “tight” or “leaky” your home is to outside air
- Moisture problems
- The condition of your appliances
- The efficiency of your heating and cooling system
- Lighting

The participating contractor may install up to \$200 worth of...

- Light bulbs with options for dimmable, candelabra, globe and LED bulbs
- Faucet aerators
- Efficient-flow fixed showerheads
- SmartStart™ shower valve
- Water heater pipe insulation

Your participating contractor could recommend improvements, which may include...

- Increasing insulation levels
- Sealing air leaks
- Replacing outdated or malfunctioning equipment
- Rebates are offered for improvements, too!

Please note, your house may have existing health and safety issues or lack of insulation quantity or quality. If identified, your participating contractor will review these issues with you. These issues need to be addressed before you're eligible for program incentives.
